- MULTIPLE CARDS MAY BE OPEN DURING THE SHOW. In order that the show run smoothly and to make the show more efficient for exhibitors, classes that "go together" for an individual exhibitor may be ridden one after the other rather than waiting until the class's scheduled time table. However, classes must be ridden in the correct order as they appear in the schedule and only three classes may be running concurrently except for the Red/Blue warm up classes that, while judged, are not ranked and scored for placing. Please see the schedule for classes affected and ask the gatekeeper at the show to help you if you are unfamiliar with this concept.
- Red/Blue warm up classes: the judge may award, at his/her discretion, a red or blue ribbon for any round. Any ribbons awarded with be announced immediately after the round is completed. In the interest of time, multiple rounds may be allowed only if time permits. Please make sure that these rounds are entered, and paid for, at the secretary's desk.

TOUCH CLASS: Table 1, touches to count. Scored on jumping faults alone. In the likely event of equality of faults for first place, successive jump offs will be held.

TABLE II—Classes scored on Faults and Time. Clear Round (Table II) - The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clean rounds or equal faults remain equal.

FAULT and OUT: (Table II, Sec. 4) Fault and Out. These competitions are timed and take place over medium sized single obstacles (combinations are not permitted). The competitor's round finishes with the first fault incurred under Table II. Points are awarded instead of faults, two points for each obstacle jumped cleanly and one point for the obstacle knocked down. The winner is the competitor who scores the greatest number of points. Time will decide in the event of equality of points.

a. An obstacle is not considered to have been jumped until the horse's forefeet have touched the ground on landing b. When an obstacle is knocked down or the Time Allowed, if there is one, has been reached, a signal is sounded. The competitor must then jump the next obstacle c. When a fault constitutes a disobedience or fall (2) With a Fixed Time Allowed which must not be set at less than 50 seconds, nor more than 60 seconds. If the competitor has jumped all the obstacles before the expiration of the Time Allowed, he starts around the course again but is not required to go back through the start markers.

ELIGIBILITY: all classes offered shall be open to all riders on horses or ponies. **See further ETHJA** rules for eligibility. Entry fee \$14.

AWARDS

- **RIBBONS** will be awarded in all regular classes through sixth place.
- Championship winners shall each receive a *RIBBON* and trophy.
- * Reserve champion winners shall receive a *RIBBON*.
- * The TRAINER of the winning rider in the Fiesta Farm EQUITATION EXTRAVAGANZA and the EQUITATION ELIMINATION will receive a \$25 gift certificate for dinner "out on the town".
- ETHJA YEAR- END AWARD points will accrue to ETHJA members and ETHJA- recorded horses and ponies in the following HUNTER divisions: Mini Hunter, Beginner Rider, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Pony, Schooling, Special, Children's, Adult/Amateur, Low, Green and Working. Points will also accrue in the following EQUITATION Divisions: Beginner Rider, 2', 14 and under, 15-17, Adult Amateur as well as in all ETHJA medal classes. Points will not accrue in any of the Featured Classes or the following classes as noted: Lead Line, Cross Rails, Walk/Trot, Fiesta Farm Hunter and Pleasure Classes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **ENTRY FEES** for all classes, except those specified below, will be \$14 per class.
- **❖** ENTRY FEES for the Fiesta Farm EQUITATION EXTRAVAGANZA and EQUITATION ELIMINATION \$20, the Lead Line and Pleasure Pairs have no entry fee.
- ❖ NEGATIVE COGGINS TESTS taken within twelve months must be available upon entering. Pony Cards for the Pony Division must also be available upon request.
- **USEF rules** will apply in all classes and situations as modified by local conditions or rules.
- SUITABLE ATTIRE is requested for all classes in the main show ring. Suitable 'practice' clothing will be satisfactory in the lower ring.
- **DOGS** and other pets should not attend the horse show.
- STABLING may be available upon request on the grounds for \$40 for the weekend beginning at 3:00 p.m. on Friday. Paddocks may also be available. Please call ahead for availability.
- The course will be set and **SCHOOLING** will be allowed before the horse show on Friday afternoon from 3:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. The Friday schooling fee is \$10 per horse, if you will not be showing on Saturday or Sunday. Horses stabling at **Fiesta Farm** and/or showing at the horse show are exempt from the Friday afternoon schooling fee.
- Two entries are required to FILL each CLASS (ETHJA specs). If there are insufficient entries in any class, it may be combined with another appropriate class or division. Examples are: Children's Hunter/Adult/Amateur Hunter; Short and Long Stirrup. The Pony Hunter, Beginner Rider Hunter and Equitation will be split if sufficient entries warrant.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

FEATURED CLASSES

The Fiesta Farm EQUITATION EXTRAVAGANZA. Open to any non-professional rider on a horse or pony. Class to consist of two phases. Phase 1: to be ridden over a hunter-type equitation course with standard distances and hunter-type fences. Phase 2: to be ridden over a jumper-type equitation course with an appropriate course and fences that may include: a parallel oxer; triple bar; hog's-back; in and out; narrow fence and/or fences without ground rails. Upon completion of the second phase, the judge will ask the top riders to return for a flat phase and further testing appropriate to the riders chosen. Riders may show at 2', 2'6" or 3', however, they may not show at a lower height than the highest height at which they showed in any other class, on the horse they will compete on, at this horse show. Ribbons to sixth place: the winner to receive a special trophy. Entry fee: \$20.

The **Fiesta Farm EQUITATION ELIMINATION**. Open to all riders on a horse or pony. Class to be composed of an initial flat phase followed by a series of tests, at the judge's discretion, based on USEF tests 1-19. No jumping. To be judged on classic position and horsemanship. Rider tests may include halt, back, ride without stirrups, hand gallop, any simple figure, horsemanship questions or change of horses. Riders will be excused throughout the class until only two remain. Ribbons to sixth place: the winner to receive a special trophy. Entry fee: \$20.

The ALL-AROUND HORSE-PERSON test. This will be a comprehensive test of general horse knowledge for any individual 21 years and younger. The test will be offered during most of the horse show. Participants must complete a written test, appropriate to their age and riding level (children who do not read well may have the proctor read the test to them), but do not have to otherwise participate in the horse show. Participants may complete the test at their convenience but by no later than 1:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon. Please allow at least 30 minutes to complete the written test which will be composed of multiple choice, fill in the blank and matching list questions and will be taken under the eye of a proctor. A score will be given for each written test. Awards shall go to three individuals and will be announced by 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Each winner shall receive a certificate as well as a custom saddle pad from the Plaid Paddock, and i-Tunes gift card. Awards will be given for riders 10 years and vounger, eleven through thirteen years, and fourteen through twenty one years. Participants need not be present at the awards ceremony. Riders may receive their test from the secretary after paying the \$10 testing fee. This test is designed to encourage riders to learn more about their sport while testing their current knowledge.

HUNTER CLASSES

MINI HUNTER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences at 18" or 2' over regular courses with a change of direction. No penalty for trotting on course. Under-saddle class to walk/trot only. In order to retain BEGINNER RIDER status, riders may NOT show at 2'.

BEGINNER RIDER HUNTER: To be shown over a simple hunter course including small flower boxes, walls and gates with a change of direction on course. To be held in the main show ring. Open to beginner riders on horses or ponies who have not shown over fences 2' or higher prior to the horse show. Riders may not show in the Lead Line class. Fences will be 18". There will be no penalty for trotting on course. Under-saddle class to walk/trot only.

WALK/TROT HUNTER UNDER SADDLE: Open to any rider eligible for the Beginner Rider division. No ETHJA points.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER: Open to any rider. No ETHJA points.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to riders twelve years of age and under on ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences 2' or higher. Pony/rider combination may not cross enter the pony Hunter Division. Fences 2'.

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to any rider in their first or second year of showing over fences 2' or higher who is either: riding a horse; or is riding a pony and is older than twelve years of age. Riders may not cross enter the Short Stirrup Hunter Division. Fences 2'.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER: Open to junior riders on horses. Fences 3'.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER: Open to adult amateur riders on horses. Fences 3'.

LOW HUNTER: Open to all horses and ponies. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 3'.

SCHOOLING HUNTER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences at 2'or 2'6".

PONY HUNTER: Open to junior riders on ponies. Pony/rider combination may not cross-enter the Short Stirrup Hunter Division. Small/medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'6". **SPECIAL HUNTER:** Open to children and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 2', 2'6" and 2'9". This division will be split into two sections. Each horse/pony may compete in **ONLY ONE SECTON** of the class.

GREEN HUNTER: Open to horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences exceeding 2' with any rider. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 2', 2'6" and 3'.

REGULAR WORKING HUNTER: Open to any horse or rider. Fences over 3'3".

FIESTA FARM HUNTER: Open to any horse or pony and any rider. Adults may ride ponies. To be split into two divisions and three different fence heights. No ETHJA points.

PLEASURE PAIRS: Open to any two horses or ponies. To be ridden as a pair and to be judged on uniformity of performance and suitability of the animal to the rider with special consideration given to the 'match' of animals and riders. To walk/trot only. No entry fee.

PLEASURE WALK, TROT & PLEASURE WALK, TROT, CANTER: open to any horse or pony an not restricted to hunter types. May jog, rack, running-walk or corto instead of trot and lope or largo instead of canter. To be judged on: suitability to the rider, manners and apparent pleasure to gait. Not to jump.

EOUITATION CLASSES

LEAD LINE EQUITATION: Open to riders eight years old and under. To be shown in-hand (led) at the walk by a competent handler of any age. To be judged on position in the saddle, use of aids, familiarity with and comfort on the animal. No ETHJA points and no entry fee. **GROUND RAIL EQUITATION**: Open to any rider eligible for the beginner rider equitation division. To be shown over a simple course of ground rails at the trot and/or canter. No changes of direction. No ETHJA points.

CROSS RAIL EQUITATION: Open to any rider. To be shown over a simple course of low cross-rails with no change of direction. No penalty for trotting on course. No ETHJA points. BEGINNER RIDER EQUITATION: Open to riders eligible for Beginner Rider Hunter. No penalty for trotting on course. Fences: 18". Course to consist of simple courses with changes of direction over small boxes and gates.

WALK/TROT EQUITATION on the flat: Open to any rider eligible for the beginner rider equitation. No ETHJA points.

14 & UNDER EQUITATION: Open to riders 14 and under on horses or ponies. Fences 2' or 2'6". 15-17 & ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION: open to rider 15-17 or adult amateurs. Fences: 2'6"

ETHJA 2'6" MEDAL: Open to junior riders on horses. To be shown over a course of fences with at least two changes of direction. A flat phase is required and shall count 25%. Further testing from USEF 1-12 may be requested at the discretion of the judge. The top ten qualifiers at the end of the season will be eligible for a special ETHJA-sponsored Medal Finals. Fences: 3'.

ETHJA ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL: Open to Adult Amateur riders on horses. Same specifications as above.

ETHJA PONY MEDAL: Open to junior riders on ponies. Same specifications as above except tests 1-8 only may be used. Small/medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'6".

JUMPER CLASSES

USEF rules for each class offered will be available at the secretary's table or may be viewed and printed at www.USEF.org

Table II, Sec. 2 (a)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round, there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.
