CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

FEATURED CLASSES

Sharon Dok TRY-CHALLENGE: Open to non-professional riders on a horses or ponies. Class to consist of 3 phases: phase (1) one to be ridden on the rider's entered horse or pony and phases (2) two and (3) three to be ridden on a horse or pony drawn from among the other horses and ponies entered. 30 minutes prior to the start of the CHALLENGE each rider shall draw for their second mount. To make the horses drawn as compatible as possible with their drawn riders, riders entered on ponies will draw from among other ponies entered and riders entered on horses will draw from among other horses entered. Further, the judge will be given the opportunity to review the horses drawn and to make any adjustments deemed necessary for safety. In phase (1), each rider entered shall compete over an equitation course on his or her entered animal. In phase (2), all riders will show on the flat in an open equitation format on their drawn animal. No schooling will be allowed prior to entering the ring on the drawn horse before phase (2) or phase (3). In phase (3) riders shall compete over a standard hunter type course on their drawn horse. Fence heights shall be 2' or 2'6", at the riders' discretion. The guideline shall be: 2' for small or medium ponies or riders who are eligible for short or long stirrup classes; 2'6" for large ponies and horses who normally show at that fence height or higher. At the conclusion of phase (3), the judge may further test the top contenders in the class. USEF tests 1-18. For each phase, the judging emphasis shall be on classic position, use of aids and ability to adapt well to an unfamiliar horse. Riders shall not be penalized for small errors but are to be rewarded for good overall horsemanship and sportsmanship. The judging guidelines suggest that phase (1) count approximately 30 %, phase (2) 25 % and phase (3) 45 %.

The winning rider shall receive a trophy and custom portrait by artist Sharon Dok valued at \$350. The horse head and shoulder portrait will be made from photographs taken of the horse or pony. Please visit the fiestafarm.com for a preview of the artist's work. Riders will ride for ribbons and participate in a victory gallop. Ribbons to 8th place. Entry fee: \$30.

The Fiesta Farm \$100 FAULT AND OUT JUMPER CLASS: USEF Table II. Section 4. See the JUMPER section for full specifications or at www.USEF.org. Ribbons to 6th place with prize money as follows: 1st \$40, 2nd \$25, 3rd \$20, 4th \$15. Entry fee \$14.

The Agri Feed Pet Supply 2', 2'6" and 3', \$500 HUNTER CLASSIC. Open to all riders and horses or ponies. The class/classes will be conducted over two rounds scored on the open numerical judging system. These rounds will NOT be a part of the normal hunter divisions. In order to meet the ETHJA requirement for double points, the class will be conducted as three separate classes with sections at: 2', 2'6" and 3'. In each section, following the first round, riders will ride their second round in reverse order with the highest score riding last. Riders must indicate on their Fiesta Farm entry for which of the following hunter divisions their double points will be applied (for year-end ETHJA purposes): Schooling, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Pony, Low, Adult Amateur, Special, Children's or Regular Working Hunter. Riders must show in, and complete the class in, one of the over fences round in their chosen division (as per USEF rules) but may ride in any other divisions as well for which they are otherwise eligible. The combined numerical score from both rounds of each of the three 2', 2'6" and 3' classes will be tabulated. Individual section ribbons through sixth place will be awarded along with an engraved trophy for each section winner. In addition, prizes for the overall Agri Feed Pet Supply HUNTER CLASSIC will be awarded as follows: prize money through eight places to the top eight riders with the highest score coming from the three individual sections. The highest score shall receive \$150, the 2nd highest score \$100, 3rd \$75, 4th \$50, 5th \$40, 6th, \$35, 7th and 8th \$25. The first place winner shall also receive an engraved trophy. Riders will ride for ribbons in each section, as well as for the over-all awards, and may participate in a victory gallop. Formal attire for the Classic is acceptable. Riders must, specify for which division they wish the points to accrue for double points to count.

BEGINNER RIDER Hunter Classic. The class will be conducted over two rounds. The first round score will be the second round score from the Beginner Rider Hunter division. Scores from both rounds will be combined to determine the over-all winner who will receive an engraved

HUNTER CLASSES

MINI HUNTER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences at 18" or 2' over regular courses with a change of direction. No penalty for trotting on course. Under-saddle class to walk/trot only. In order to retain BEGINNER RIDER status, riders may NOT show at 2'.

BEGINNER RIDER HUNTER: To be shown over a simple hunter course including small flower boxes, walls and gates with a change of direction on course. To be held in the main show ring. Open to beginner riders on horses or ponies who have not shown over fences 2' or higher prior to the horse show. There will be no penalty for trotting on course. Under-saddle class to walk/trot only. Fences 18".

WALK/TROT HUNTER UNDER SADDLE: Open to any rider eligible for the Beginner Rider division. To be judged as an under-saddle class. Walk/trot only. No ETHJA points. CROSS RAIL HUNTER: Open to any rider. To be shown over small cross rails twice around.

No ETHJA points. SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to riders twelve years of age and under on ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences 2' or higher. Pony/rider combination may not cross enter the pony Hunter Division. Fences 2'.

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to any rider in their first or second year of showing over fences 2' or higher who is either: riding a horse; or is riding a pony and is older than twelve years of age. Riders may not cross enter the Short Stirrup Hunter Division. Fences 2'.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER: Open to junior riders on horses. Fences 3'.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER: Open to adult amateur riders on horses. Fences 3'.

LOW HUNTER: Open to all horses and ponies. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 3'.

SCHOOLING HUNTER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences at 2'or 2'6".

PONY HUNTER: Open to junior riders on ponies. Pony/rider combination may not cross-enter the Short Stirrup Hunter Division. Small/medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'6". SPECIAL HUNTER: Open to children and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 2', 2'6" and 2'9". This division will be split into two sections. Each horse/pony may compete in **ONLY ONE SECTON** of the class.

GREEN HUNTER: Open to horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences exceeding 2' with any rider. Adults may ride ponies. Fences 2', 2'6" and 3'.

REGULAR WORKING HUNTER: Open to any horse or rider. Fences over 3'3.

FIESTA FARM LOW HUNTER: Open to any horse, pony or rider. Fences 18" & 2', no oxers. FIESTA FARM HIGH HUNTER: Open to any horse, pony or rider. Fences 2'6" & 2'9".

JUMPER CLASSES

USEF rules for each class offered will be available at the secretary's table or may be viewed and printed at www.USEF.org

Table II, Sec. 2 (a)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round, there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.

TOUCH CLASS: Table 1, touches to count. Scored on jumping faults alone. In the likely event of equality of faults for first place, successive jump offs will be held.

TABLE II—Classes scored on Faults and Time. Clear Round (Table II) - The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clean rounds or equal faults remain equal.

FAULT and OUT: (Table II, Sec. 4) Fault and Out. These competitions are timed and take place over medium sized single obstacles (combinations are not permitted). The competitor's round finishes with the first fault incurred under Table II. Points are awarded instead of faults, two points for each obstacle jumped cleanly and one point for the obstacle knocked down. The winner is the competitor who scores the greatest number of points. Time will decide in the event of equality of points.

a. An obstacle is not considered to have been jumped until the horse's forefeet have touched the ground on landing b. When an obstacle is knocked down or the Time Allowed, if there is one, has been reached, a signal is sounded. The competitor must then jump the next obstacle c. When a fault constitutes a disobedience or fall (2) With a Fixed Time Allowed which must not be set at less than 50 seconds, nor more than 60 seconds. If the competitor has jumped all the obstacles before the expiration of the Time Allowed, he starts around the course again but is not required to go back through the start markers. \$100 prize money split \$40, \$25, \$20, \$15.

ELIGIBILITY: all classes offered shall be open to all riders on horses or ponies. **See further ETHJA rules for eligibility.** Entry fee \$14.

EQUITATION CLASSES

GROUND RAIL EQUITATION: Open to any rider eligible for the beginner rider equitation division. To be shown over a simple course of ground rails twice around. No ETHJA points. CROSS RAIL EQUITATION: Open to any rider. To be shown over a simple course of low cross-rails with no change of direction. No penalty for trotting on course. No ETHJA points. BEGINNER RIDER EQUITATION: Open to riders eligible for Beginner Rider Hunter. No penalty for trotting on course. Fences: 18". Course to consist of simple courses with changes of direction over small boxes and gates.

WALK/TROT EQUITATION on the flat: Open to any rider eligible for the beginner rider equitation. No ETHJA points.

14 & UNDER EQUITATION: Open to riders 14 and under on horses or ponies. Fences 2' or 2'6". 15-17/ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION: open to rider 15-17 or adult amateurs. Fences: 2'6" or 3'. ETHJA 2'6" MEDAL: Open to junior or adult amateur riders on horses. To be shown over a course of fences with at least two changes of direction. A flat phase is required and shall count 25%. Further testing from USEF 1-14 may be requested at the discretion of the judge. The top ten qualifiers at the end of the season will be eligible for a special ETHJA-sponsored Medal Finals. Fences: 2'6".

ETHJA 3' MEDAL: Open to junior and adult amateur riders on horses. Same specifications as above. Fences 3'.

ETHJA PONY MEDAL: Open to junior riders on ponies. Same specifications as above. Small/medium ponies to jump 2', large ponies to jump 2'6".

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

WALK/TROT PLEASURE: Open to any rider. Horse to trot, jog, rack, running walk or corto. To be judged on manners, movement and suitability to the rider.

WALK/TROT/CANTER PLEASURE: Open to any rider. Horse to jog, rack, running walk or corto & canter, jog or largo. To be judged on manners, movement and suitability to the rider. HUNTER HACK: Open to any rider eligible and horse. To be judged at the walk/trot/canter/hand gallop and selected animals may be asked to jump 2 small jumps at the trot or canter.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- ENTRY FEES for all classes, except those specified below, will be \$14 per class with a MAXIMUM COST FOR THE WHOLE HORSE SHOW PER HORSE/RIDER of \$100 for classes entered, not including the special classes.
- ENTRY FEES for the Sharon Dok TRY-CHALLENGE and Agri Feed Pet

Supply Hunter Classic \$25.

- ❖ NEGATIVE COGGINS TESTS taken within twelve months must be available upon entering. Pony Cards for the Pony Division must also be available upon request.
- **USEF rules** will apply in all classes & situations as modified by local conditions or rules.
- SUITABLE ATTIRE is requested for all classes in the main show ring. Suitable 'practice' clothing will be satisfactory in the lower ring.
- **DOGS** and other pets should not attend the horse show.
- **STABLING** may be available upon request on the grounds for \$40 for the weekend beginning at 3:00 p.m. on Friday. Paddocks may also be available at a lower rate.
- The course will be set and SCHOOLING allowed before the horse show Friday afternoon from 3:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. Friday schooling fee is \$10 per horse, if you will not be showing on Saturday or Sunday. Horses stabling at Fiesta Farm and/or showing at the horse show are exempt from the Friday afternoon schooling fee.
- Two entries are required to FILL each CLASS. If there are insufficient entries in any class, it may be combined with another appropriate class or division.
- MULTIPLE CARDS MAY BE OPEN DURING THE SHOW. In order that the show run smoothly and to make the show more efficient for exhibitors, classes that "go together" for an individual exhibitor may be ridden one after the other rather than waiting until the class's scheduled time table. However, classes must be ridden in the correct order as they appear in the schedule and only three classes may be running concurrently except for the Red/Blue warm up classes that, while judged, are not ranked and scored for placing. Please see the schedule for classes affected and ask the gatekeeper at the show to help you if you are unfamiliar with this concept.
- Red/Blue warm up classes: the judge may award, at his/her discretion, a red or blue ribbon for any round. Any ribbons awarded with be announced immediately after the round is completed. In the interest of time, multiple rounds may be allowed only if time permits. Please make sure that these rounds are entered, and paid for, at the secretary's desk.

AWARDS

- **RIBBONS** will be awarded in all regular classes through sixth place.
- ❖ Championship winners shall each receive a *RIBBON* and engraved *TROPHY*.
- Reserve champion winners shall receive a *RIBBON*.
- ETHJA YEAR- END AWARD points will accrue to ETHJA members and ETHJA-recorded horses and ponies in the following HUNTER divisions: Mini, Beginner Rider, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Pony, Schooling, Special, Children's, Adult/Amateur, Low, Green and Working. Points will also accrue in the following EQUITATION Divisions: Beginner Rider, 2', 14 and under, 15-17, Adult Amateur as well as in all ETHJA medal classes. Points will not accrue in any of the Featured Classes, except the Classic, or the following classes as noted: Cross Rails, Walk/Trot, Fiesta Farm Low Hunter, and the Fiesta Farm High Hunter.
